The corrections below are listed by page number. They are grouped into three categories: (1) Important errors that will cause confusion, (2) minor errors that might cause confusion, and (3) trivial errors that should not cause confusion.

**Important errors:**

114: 1st line after Eq. (3.140): Delete “(not necessarily for the first time),” since the point  $(a, b)$  in the plane can be hit at most once (after exactly  $a + b$  steps). The point  $(a, b)$  in the plane corresponds to  $a$  rightward steps and  $b$  leftward steps, which yields a position  $a - b$  in the 1-D random walk. You may very well pass through this  $a - b$  position many times, but you can pass through the point  $(a, b)$  in the 2-D plane only once.
